

What to Bring- Acuña 2010

You are allowed one carry-on, one personal item, and one bag which must weigh no more than 50 pounds. You are responsible for paying for that checked bag (\$25) on the way down and we will pay it on the way back.

Note: All liquids over 3 ounces (including sunscreen and shampoo) must be put in checked bag. You are also welcome to buy these items at Wal-Mart in Texas.

Clothes

- Two-three pairs of shorts
- Enough underwear, socks, and shirts for 7 days (we will *not* be doing laundry)
- Work clothes for 4 days of construction—*pants only*. Shirts must have sleeves—no tank tops or sleeveless shirts.
- Work shoes (don't have to be boots, but should have a closed toe and heel—no clogs)
- Shoes or sandals for around base
- Shower shoes
- Bathing suit—do your best to bring a modest one
- No nose rings or body rings, no earrings on guys in public
- Team t-shirt (you'll get this in early June)

Other supplies

- Bible, pen
- Wet-wipes/ Purell (or whatever) disinfectant hand gel
- Towel/washcloth
- Pillow
- Toiletries (put them in your checked bag unless liquids are under 3 ounces)
- Sleeping bag and camp mat/blow-up bed if desired
- Flashlight (if desired)
- Ear plugs (if desired, for sleeping)
- Hammer
- Tool belt or nail pouch (if you have one)
- Tape measure and pencil (if you have them)
- Work gloves
- Water bottle (Nalgene or similar) and carabiner
- Sunscreen and protective lip balm
- Sunglasses
- Hat
- Camera and extra batteries
- Travel Kleenex
- Small toys, t-shirts, toiletries to give to Mexican people if you wish
- Spending money (no more than \$100—\$75 is sufficient)
- Passport or passport card or birth certificate (adults must have a passport or passport card)
